### January/February

During the seasons of Lent and Pentecost, we led a series of worship concerts, "From the Cradle to the ," Pentecost, in which we traced the life of Christ in Scripture and song. While we experienced powerful visitation of the Holy Spirit, our partners in Nepal had their world shaken by one of the most powerful earthquakes on record. Training was held in both countries during the day, along with free medical clinics and village evangelism in the evenings. Hundreds were saved, healed, and delivered. The Lord's caution in our hearts kept us from joining the mission, and when the Nigeria mission had to be postponed for 2 months due to elections, we understood why.



## June/July

The summer months saw the birth of Youth Community Explosion and the joy of watching the hearts of teenagers unfold in the presence of God's love. For seven weeks, the students memorized Scripture, played crazy games, learned what it means to be a disciple, made fun field trips, and reached out to serve those in need. New staff, provided by God Himself, are gifted and anointed to lead this ministry in such a time as this.
