Plans are underway for the 2013 Africa mission to Ghana and Nigeria. The mission team will leave for Ghana on March I. We will be in the historical Cape Coast area of Ghana and will go out to rural areas to plant churches and minister to the villages. We will also take some time to visit the Cape Coast castle used in the Atlantic slave trade. The team will leave Ghana on March 11.



The Nigeria mission will begin on March 10 in the Ngbo diocese in the southeast region. As in Ghana, we will plant churches, provide medical clinics, and other programs in the surrounding villages. The team will arrive back in the U.S. on March 18.

GOOD MORNING, HOLY SPIRIT!



Is it okay to pray to or talk to the Holy Spirit? Is that allowed? Most of us can relate to the idea of God the Father because He's...well, a Father. We have many chapters in the Bible describing to us the life of Christ. But the Holy Spirit doesn't seem to get His due, even if He is the third Person of the Trinity. It's like He's not really as real as Jesus or the Father. After all, they call Him the "Ghost". It reminds you of some divine form of gas that floats in and out of rooms and through walls.

When people talk about the fruit of the Holy Spirit they say, "I have a lot of joy, but I just don't have patience." What is that - I have the Holy Spirit, but I only have one leg of Him? When they talk about the gifts of the Spirit they say, "My gift is discernment." Does that mean I have the Spirit but only one eye of Him? He is either a Person, or He's not. You either have all of Him, or you have none of Him. The only requirement for having all of Him is to be born again, having surrendered your life to Jesus Christ (I Cor. 12:13). And He is not a ghost. He is a Person. As an athlete. Llove it that He is called the Great Para

Cor.12:13). And He is not a ghost. He is a Person. As an athlete, I love it that He is called the Great Paraclete (John 14:16). In the original Greek Olympics, a paraclete was one who ran alongside of the long distance runners shouting encouraging and challenging words. He provided strength, companionship, direction, and probably Gatorade[®]! But he was real, and he was really there.

For us today, the Holy Spirit is the Myth Buster, guarding us from deception and leading us into truth (John 14:17). He is the Attitude Adjuster, filling us with the life and attitudes of Christ (14:19). He is the Ultimate Adventurer, leading us valiantly and fearlessly into the great unknown of our futures. He is the Divine Reminder, convicting us about our thoughts, words, and actions (John 16:8). And, by the way, you have all of Him. All of His fruit dwells in you (Galatians 5:22,23). By your Spirit-led choices today, you can let that fruit grow up. All of His gifts dwell in you (I Corinthians 12). You don't have to ask for the gifts. You have them. You've got it all because you have all of Him! How good is that? Give the Holy Spirit His due then. If you are a believer, then the question isn't is the Holy Spirit in you.

So, we can pray, "Good morning, Holy Spirit! We welcome you into our lives today. Because Christ sent you to dwell in us, we have everything we need today to be all He called us to be. May your fruit and your gifts flow out of us, as you will, that Christ might be seen in us! Amen!" ~ Bill Buckley
