
- Approximately 2800 ft² office space (added \approx 300 ft² in 2013)





India

2013 India Mission (CWM Staff)

- Visited over 20 churches from NW to SE India
- Baptized over 200 people
- Led pastor training in Seranga (NE India) and Mt Zion (South India)
- Preached at village crusades
- Participated in 2 weddings
- Taught morning devotions and afternoon prayer sessions at Living Hope Campus
- Taught classes for Bible College students



- Orphanage—apprx 200 children
- Primary school—280 students
- Bible College—96 students (turned away students for lack of space)
- Sewing school/business
- Jaya Institute of Paramedical Sciences (Nursing School) 84 students
- Churches—1000 with apprx 700 pastors
- Vacation Bible school—apprx 5000 children (majority from Hindu families)
- Medical clinics, open daily

Ghana and Nigeria, Africa

2013 Mission (CWM Staff and team)

- Visited 18 previously planted churches
- Conducted leadership training for over 300 pastors and lay leaders
- Apprx 5000 people came to Christ during Africa missions
- Over 400 churches (Plant 10 in each country every year)
- Children's ministry (included 5 boys ages 10-12 on mission team), agricultural program (included Mississippi State University Ag student on mission team), and medical clinics (indigenous doctors) in villages where new churches are being planted
- Pastor training (over 40 pastors trained in 2013)







Nepal

- Taught community Bible study fellowship
- Led 3 day women's conference
- Established relationship with James Poudel, Presbyterian pastor and Director of 2nd District Ecumenical Churches in the state of Dhankuta
