


NEW BOOK RELEASE

Cecil, Nathan and a Beautiful Reunion

Occasionally, God lets you see the amazing fruit He brings from the life of a traveling preacher. This summer, at the Mississippi United Methodist Annual Conference, we were enthralled by the music of the featured guest saxophonist. Looking up his name, Nathan Woodward, Lee Ann discovered a very sweet connection. In the mid-1980's, she and her dad, Cecil, led a revival in Neenah, WI, when a 16-year old girl and her family arranged a meeting with them. Pregnant and unmarried, she wanted to find a good home for her baby and wondered if they could help. Cecil made a phone call home that night and discovered that his secretary had just spent time in prayer with a pastor's wife, heart-broken that she and her husband were unable to conceive and longed to adopt. A few months later, Sherry Woodward was present in the hospital



when he was born, and little Nathan was placed in her arms.

worship, baptize babies, grieve over their loses and learn the power of God together as a church family. So, this small fellowship of believers has built a church in the remote village of Kokotiesua, Ghana. Henry's Chapel is shaking the nations for His glory! GOING DEEPER



Over the past year, God continues to draw me back to chapter 47 in the book of Ezekiel, and each time, He has something new for me to learn about Him and my walk with Him. The chapter begins with the prophet describing the river flowing from the temple. It is beautiful imagery of the water coming from the dwelling place of God. At first the water began as a trickle flowing under the south side of the temple, south of the altar. Then it became ankle deep, knee deep, waist deep and then so deep that no one could cross. Oddly enough, the farther away it got from the temple,

the deeper the water became even though there were no other feeder streams. The only water supply was that trickle that originated in the temple.

Now, there might be many interpretations of what Ezekiel saw, but let's consider this. If the river represents the Gospel, the very Word and presence of God, then why would it be deeper the farther away it got from the temple? We go to our church, our temple if you will, and expect to experience His presence, and I hope we do. However, maybe we don't truly experience His power and presence until we are further away from the com-

fort and safety of the church. Maybe it's when we are out in the world, among those people who are not even comfortable in the church, where we must rely completely on Him. When I am with my Christian friends and all is well and safe, close to the temple, I am quite possibly only wading in His presence. But when I am out ministering to the hurting, the broken, the ones who do not know Him, that is when I am at a point when I can't "cross that river" alone and when I must rely even more on Him and His power.

I encourage you to go deeper with the Lord. Wander further out than your Sunday school class and worship service. Go beyond what feels safe and comfortable and reach out to a broken world. The flow of His presence will carry you.
