



INDIA: Unspeakable tragedy gripped Gorakhpur when a hospital was unable to pay for oxygen used for patients. The supply was turned off and more than 72 children died. (left) Reassuring these families that God sees and desires to lift their sorrow is critical. Tragedies like these are all-too-common across the sub-continent. This amazing little fellow (right) is a reminder of just



how powerful God’s love is. Shocked by an event he witnessed as a toddler, he began to speak incessantly. Every school rejected him until his parents brought him to the Living Hope Campus. After hearing the Gospel, the entire family became followers of Christ and little Vishwa is now receiving the help he needs.



NIGERIA: In the arid, desert region of Northern Nigeria, 5.2 million people, displaced by Boko Haram, are now facing severe food scarcity. Of the more than 300 churches CWM has helped to establish in Nigeria, approximately 10% are in this area. Sir J.K. Udeze has recently conducted follow-up of churches planted in the Makurdi Diocese in 2010, three of which have closed



when their pastors left in fear. The largest church in that area, “known as NKST, *does not* discourage believers from practicing witchcraft, drunkenness, and immorality.” They need a church that preaches truth. The group to the right needs help to complete their building. The rainy season was tough for them under their tree! All of the churches need help with basic provisions, land for buildings, chairs, sound equipment, etc.

NORTH STARKVILLE OUTREACH: God provides! In May, the organization that provided our Americorps VISTA staff decided not to renew their grant. This program provided 3 full-time workers for us at absolutely no cost to the ministry! Loss of these workers was devastating. BUT GOD! Another local organization has agreed to serve as our umbrella, and we currently have four full-time workers! They do not officially start until September 11, but since that is also the start date of Youth Community Explosion, we have asked them all to begin this month so that we can train them and then plan and prepare for the semester before we start. We hope to provide a love offering for all of these precious young adults. Two of our students who have aged-out of the program are returning to serve as junior counselors! We are so proud of them!



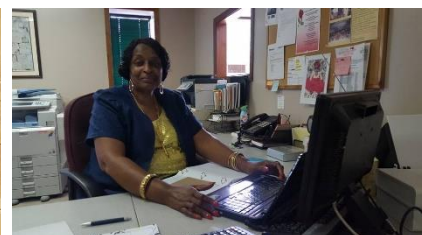
